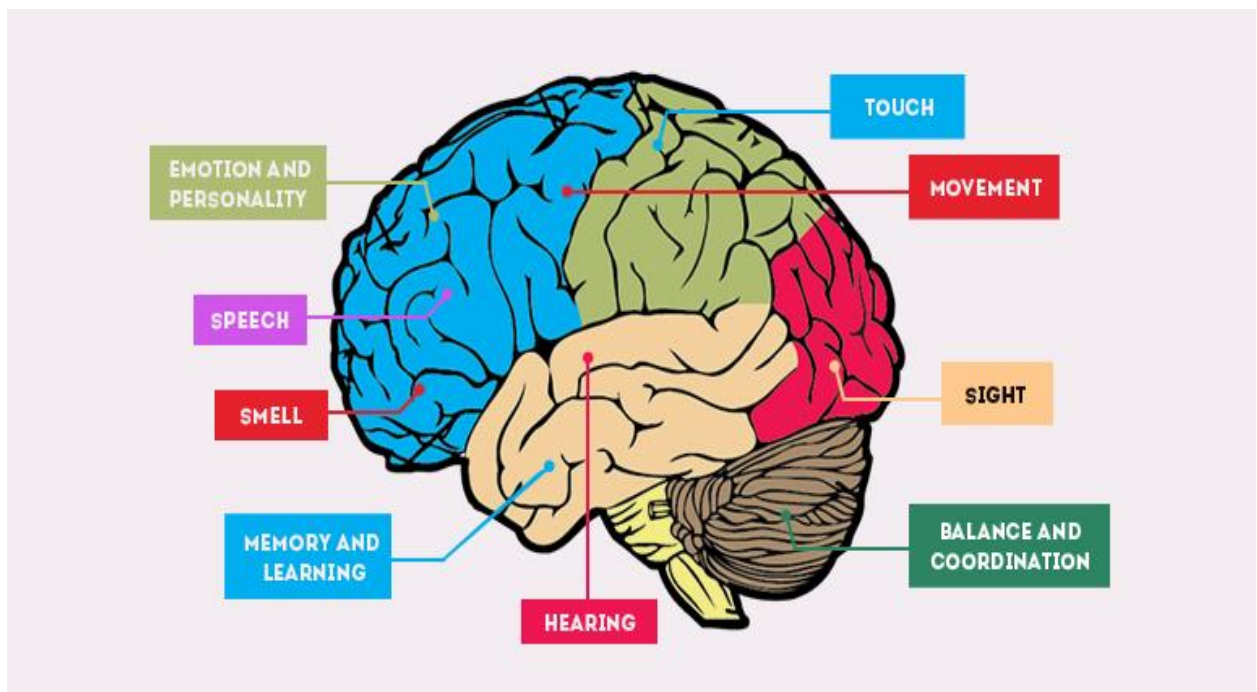


## MFT Stroke Education group
